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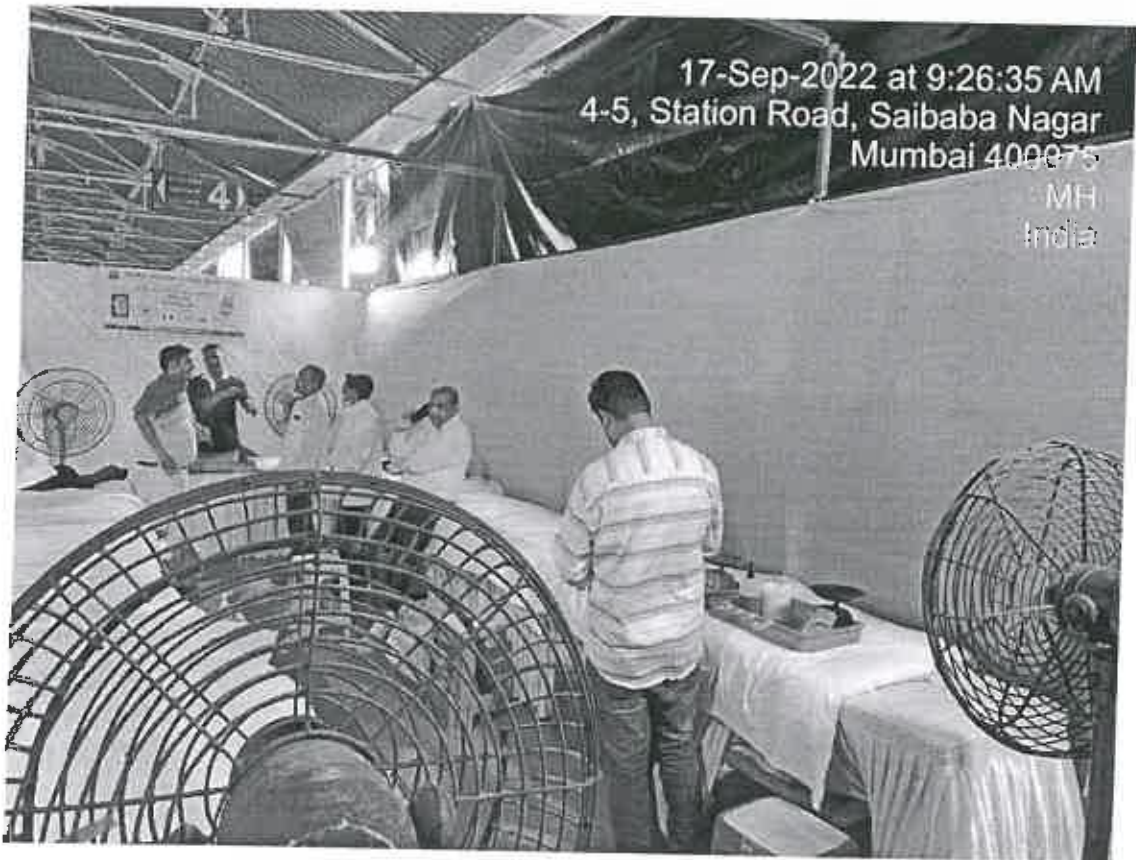
Report - NSS BLOOD DONATION CAMP

Even girls' students also taking their own education and spending their earnings on education and looking after their houses. Some widows and divorcee girls are also taking education in our institute with their stressful mind. In order to take out from such stress NSS unit of our college and Stree Mukti Sanghatana decided to set up help desk in the college and try to counsel them and make them free from stress. Stree Mukti Sanghatana decided that they will appoint their official counsellor and that counsellor will counsel them in right direction. In this process of counselling the discussion between students and counsellor will be kept confidential. 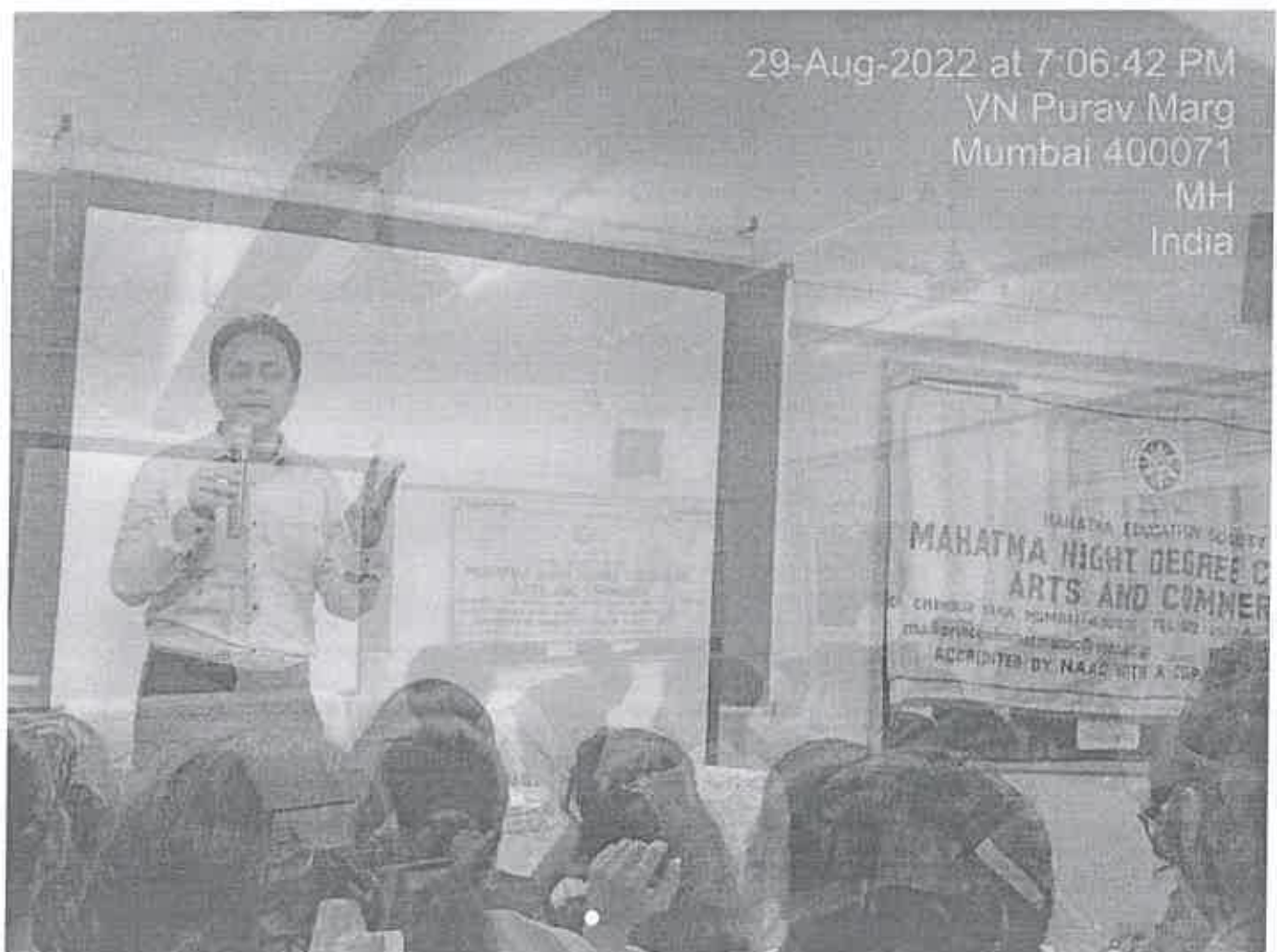

Dr. Nayak spoke about careers in information technology. He explained how B.Com. students can do courses in computer software and hardware and very easily blend into the IT industry. Further

he spoke about careers in website designing, business opportunities in instagram, and other social media. He said we could conduct training programmes, tutorials and create interesting content that would attract many viewers. The business model for online business was clearly explained.

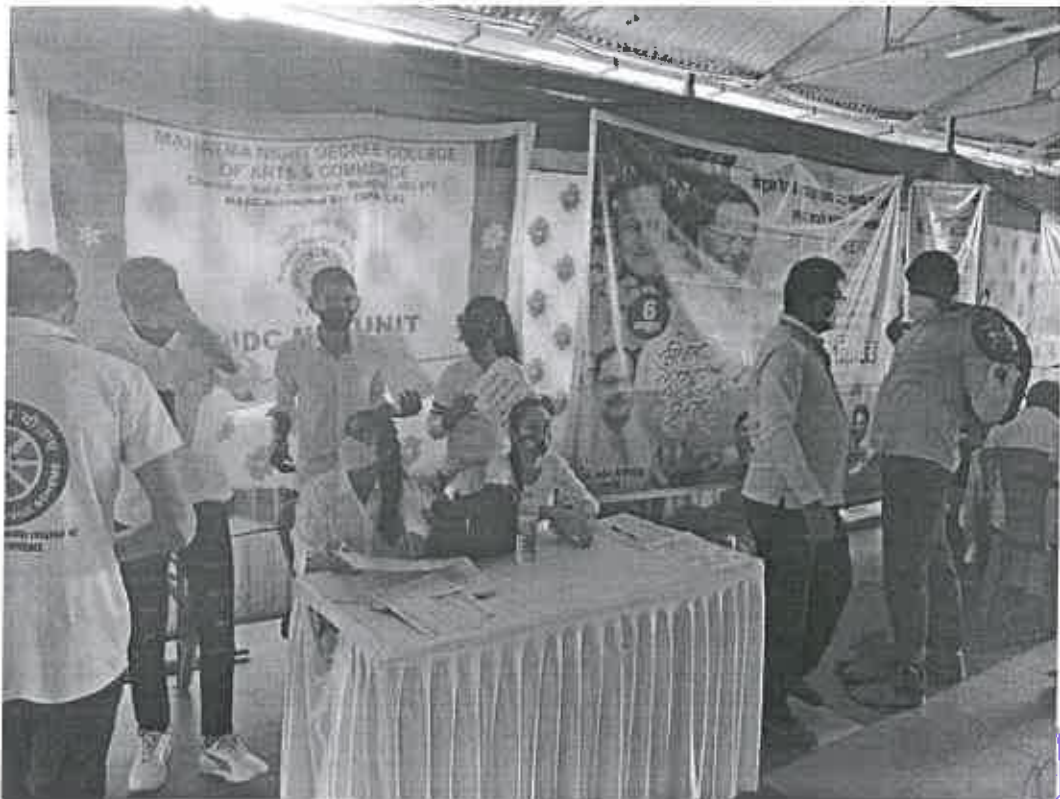
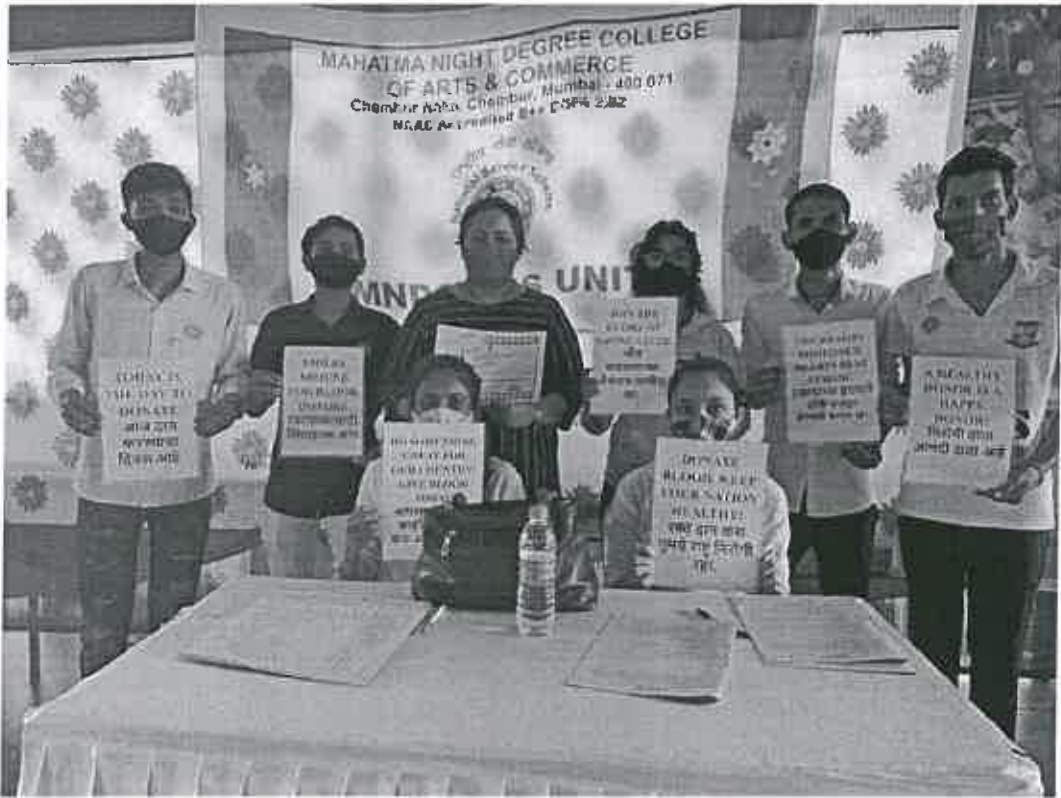
The NSS Volunteers worked sincerely and enthusiastically. Tea and snacks were given to blood donors and the team of organizers.

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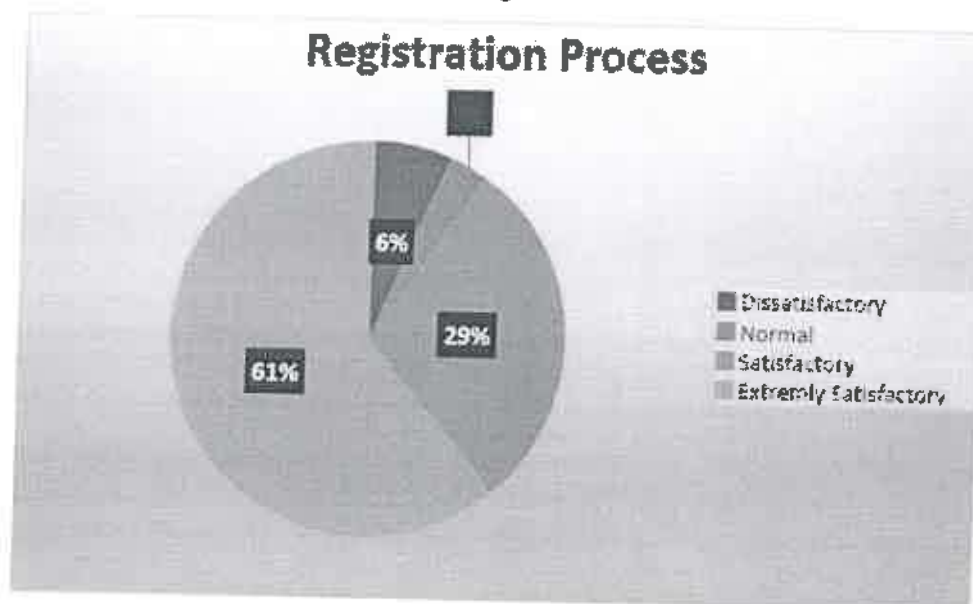

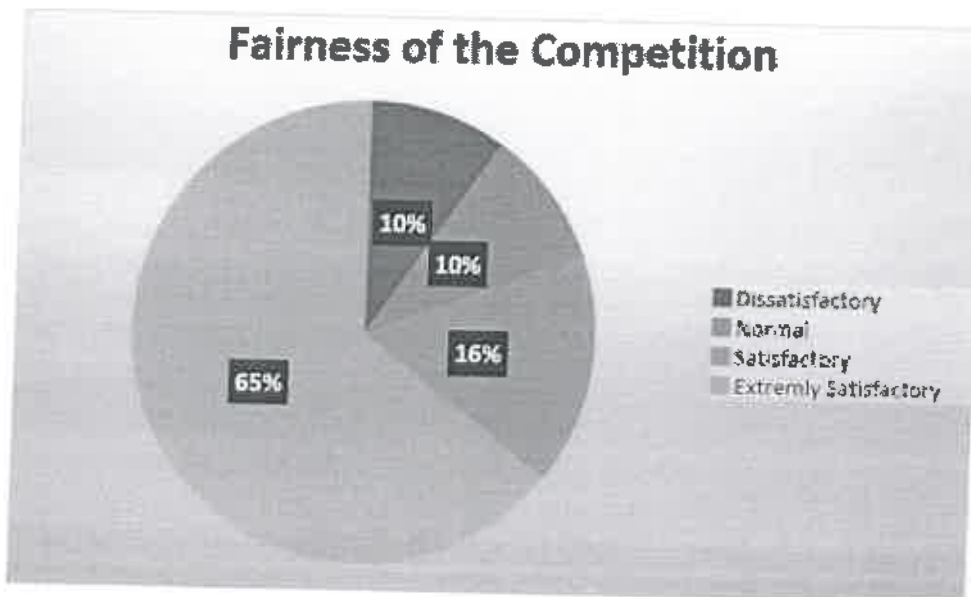
Figure 2: Fairness of the competition

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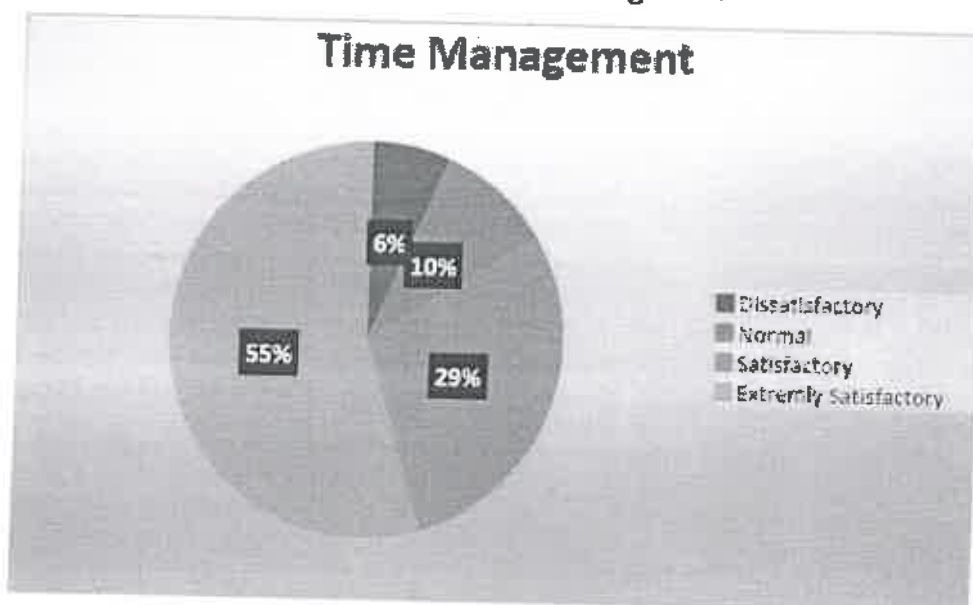

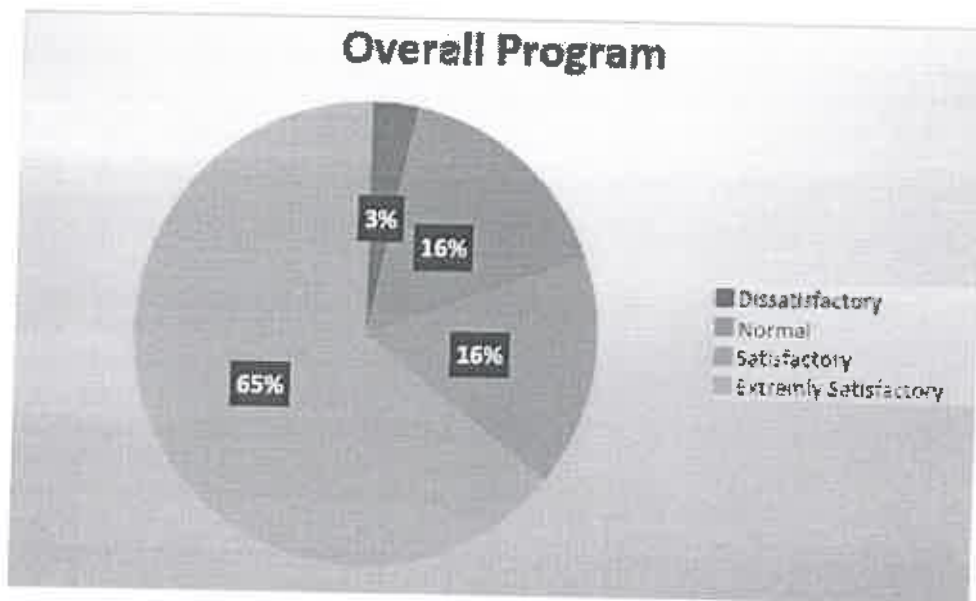

Some of them were on medication and recovering from illness etc.

During the camp we received calls and messages of commendation from the Principal, teachers, students and MU NSS Director Shri. Sudhir Puranik. Puranik Sir said, "Every unit of blood collected is precious during this Covid-19 Pandemic period, Well done Mahatma Night Degree College NSS Volunteers!"

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The MNDC Mela 2018 was a joint effort by the Mahatma Night Degree College of Arts and Commerce, Chembur Placement Cell with MCC Model Career Centre, CII Confederation of Indian Industries and MoLE Ministry of Labour and Employment. event a success. She believes that it is one step taken towards moving closer to the mission statement of the college.



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

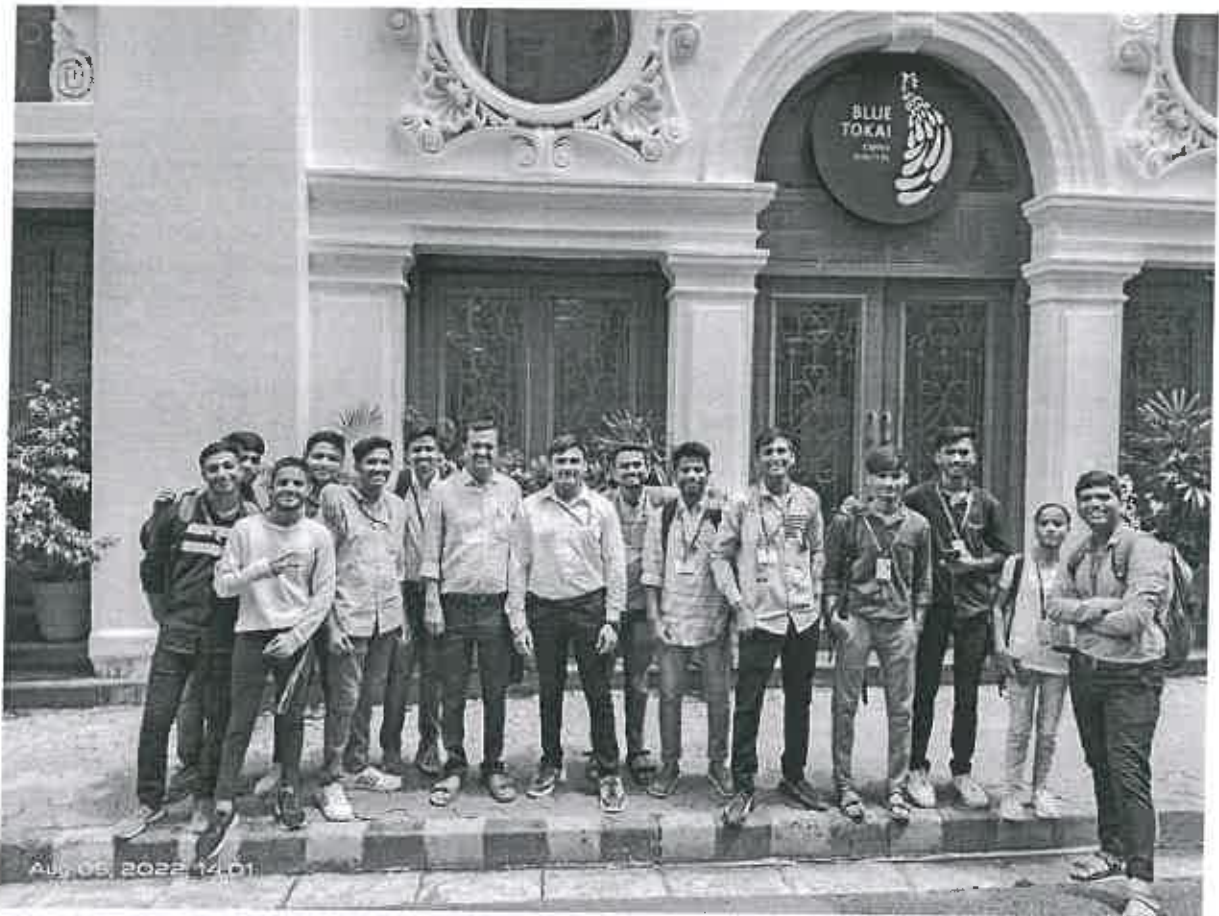



Prof. Dr. Lata Krishnan reported to college at 8.00am. With the help of support staff, this team set up the interview desks in the campus as per floor plan made. Every desk was given a number. The company List put up at the entrance of the college had the columns serial number, company name, address of company (job location), job / position vacant, number of vacancies for each position, salary per annum and floor plan giving room number and desk number.</p> <p>Students registered by scanning the QR code to register for the MNDC Placement Mela 2021-22. The entire registration process was paperless. The Company List put up contained all the information a student participant required to participate in the job fair. At a glance they could select the company and know exactly where to go for the interview. The registration desk also registered the company</p>

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participants who reported for the event.

The MNDC Placement Mela was inaugurated at 10.30 am by Dr. K.M. Vasudevan Pillai, Chairman and C.E.O. Mahatma Education Society's Pillai Group of Institutions. After cutting the ribbon in the presence of Company Participants, student participants from colleges across Mumbai and teachers, Dr. Pillai explained the importance of preparing well for a company interview. He explained how every candidate should introduce oneself giving a clear explanation of his strengths and the reason why he is the best candidate for the position. He thanked all the company participants for coming to the campus for the job fair and motivated the students to do their best at the interviews. "Even if you do not get selected, this exercise is very useful as it will prepare you to do better the next time," said Dr. K.M. Vasudevan Pillai.
