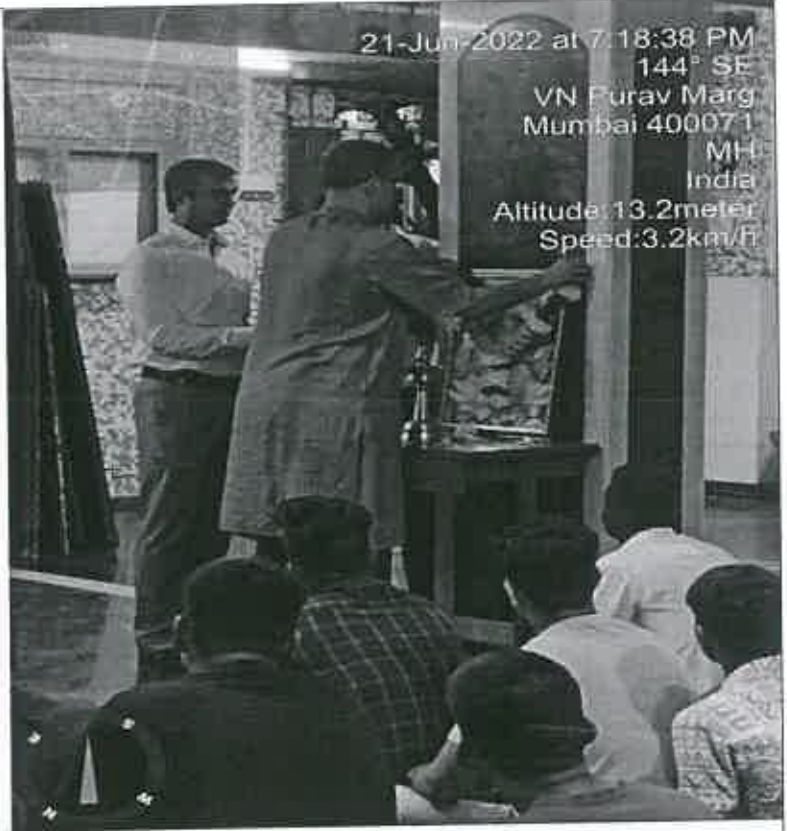
1. Yama - principles of moral code (Ahimsa, Satya, Asteya, Brahmacharya, Aparigah)

Brief Report of the Program:-	<p>This special workshop was organized by the NSS unit of our college in association with Stree Mukti Sanghatana on the 24th and 25th November 2021 in our college. About 105 students (boys and girls) from first year, second year and third year participated in the both days sessions.</p> <p>On the first day, the 24th November 2021 the session was inaugurated by the I/C Principal Dr. Eknath Zhrekar and Resource person Ms. Sangeeta Saraf. Assoc. Prof. Tushar A. Pawar introduced the guest of honor and the resource person Ms. Sangeeta Saraf.</p> <p>The opening session was delivered by Ms. Sangeeta Saraf on the topic Gender equality. The speaker highlighted need of considering equal physical and mental power in both genders. She underlined that the time had come to respect mutually and appreciate the strength in each other. It is also pointed out that unlike previous generation, females cannot be side line in any area. The session was a strong attempt to erase the mind-set existing even in the young generation with a reserved discriminative mentality. However, the entire session was thought provoking and very much Live. The students came forward with a few queries and the speaker clarified them very well.</p> <p>The second session of the day was on selection of life partner. This was also very interesting and very much interactive. The speaker then motivated the students to imagine the scene of their proposing to their life partner. After some time, the speaker collected their demands made to their partner at the time of proposal. Each demand was jotted down on the board and analysed them. 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

In the second session, Dr. Vilas Gaikar opined about politics of research. He defined it as how research is influenced by human issues that are unrelated to research topics. He said that research should be focused on problem solving over creating issues. Lastly, sir discussed issue of predatory journals and how can a researcher save their paper from these journal. There is a proper UGC care list journal and Scopus journal so the researcher should verified the details of all the journal. Participant asked many question on how to publish their article in the good journal. All the doubts were resolved by the resource person. Asst. Prof. Harsh Shukla proposed formal vote of thanks for the session.

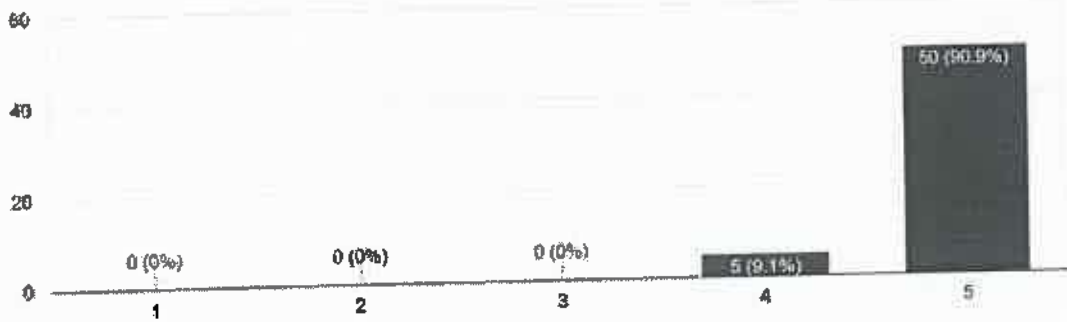

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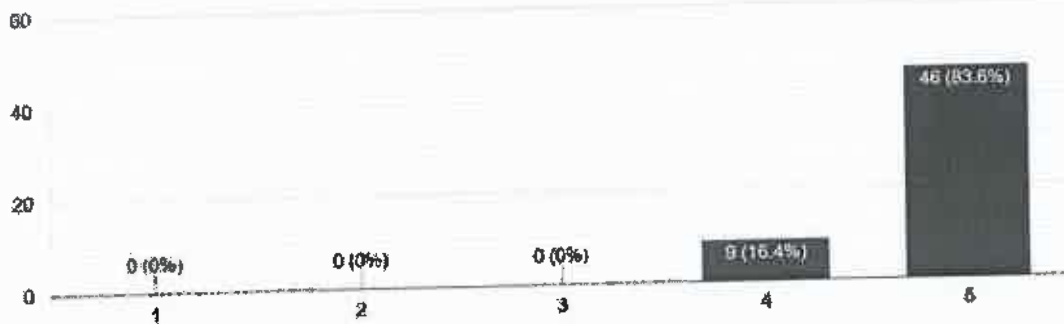
Relevance of Course

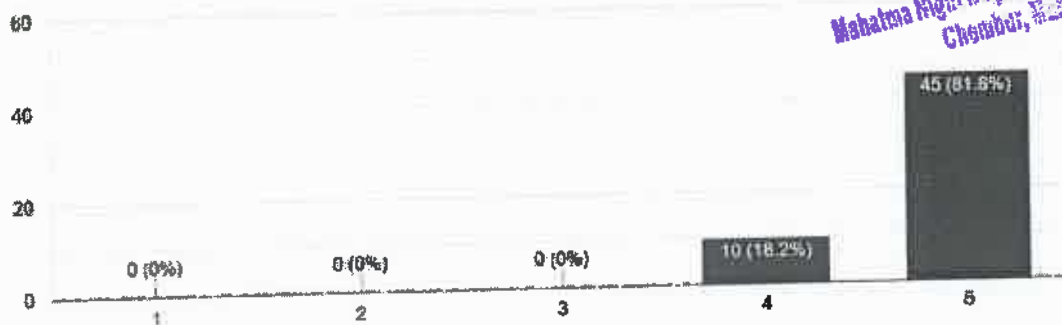
Applicability of course in present job or research

Effectiveness of programme delivery

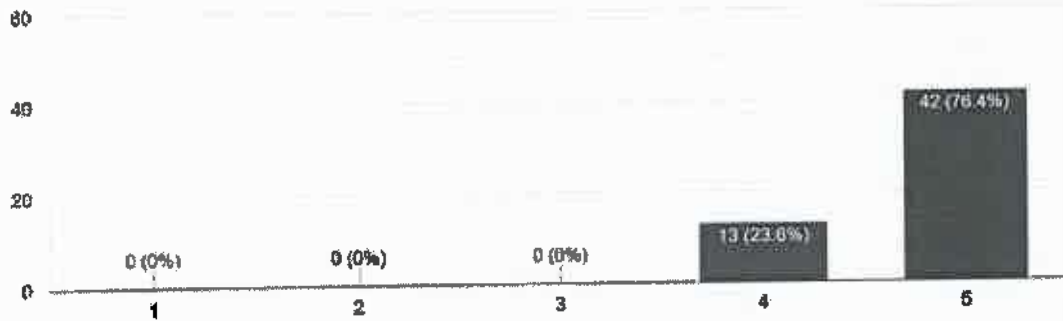

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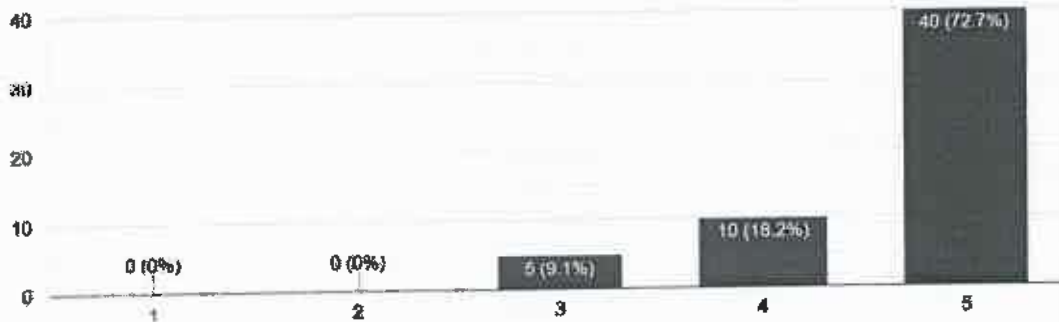
Competence of Resource Persons

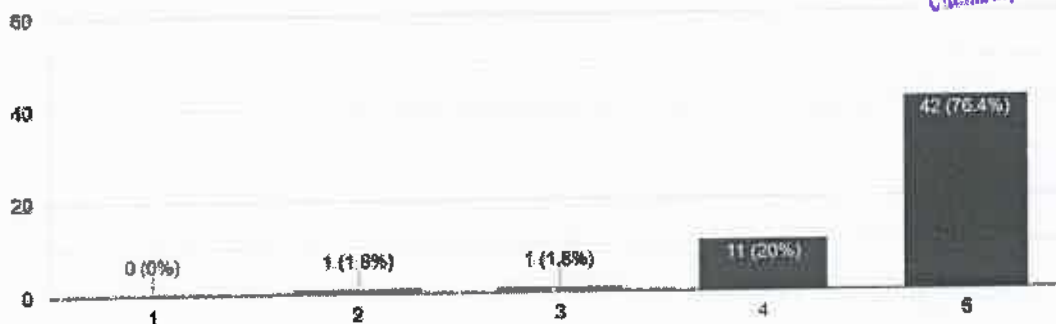
Duration of Programme

Learning values in terms of Concept, Knowledge, Analytical abilities and Broadening perspective

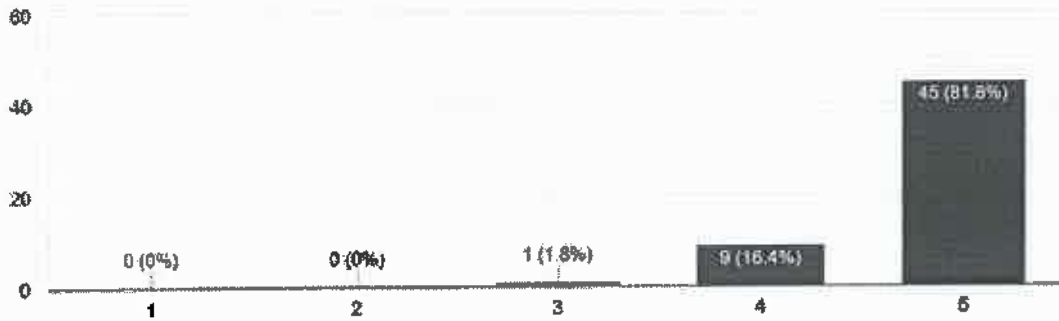

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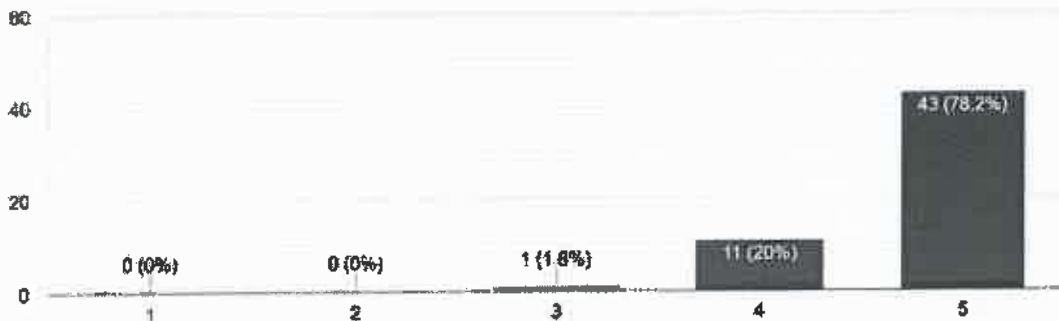
Research Orientation

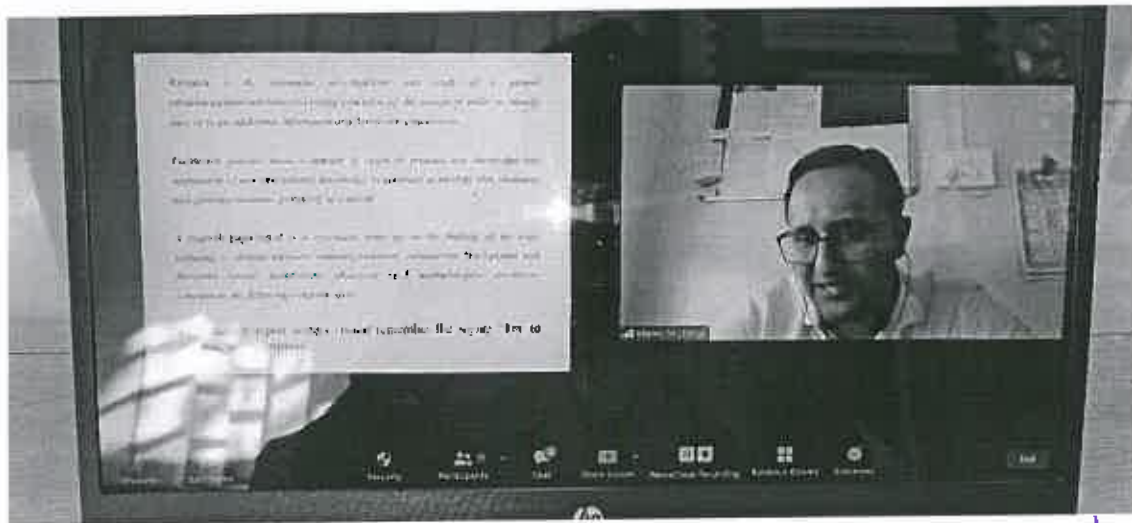
Scope of Implementation


The program started at 4.30 p.m. with the opening remarks given by Principal Dr. Eknath Zhrekar. The welcome address was given by Asst. Prof. Harsh Shukla. Dr. Anaya Markandeya introduced the resource person Dr. Vilas Gaikar.

The budget has its impact on every section of society either directly or indirectly. We need to understand the positives and negatives impacts of a budget on an individual's life. Covid-19 pandemic destroyed the world economy except for china and caused the loss of life all over the world. Dr. Vilas Gaikar stressed that this year we might face a negative growth rate. This situation comes once in a century. However, It is expected that the Indian economy will achieve 11 percent growth rate in 2021-22. During the time of the Covid-19 pandemic, we should not think about the fiscal deficit.

Dr. Gaikar emphasized that there should be appropriate employment opportunities available in the unorganized sector. Industrial Growth should be given priority as it can provide more employment in the economy. Agricultural reforms have become a controversial issue in the current circumstances. It should be noted that only the agriculture sector showed positive growth even when industry and services failed to show any positivity. Sir said that this year we need to focus on how to survive and next year we should focus on how to revive the economy.

The government and revenue collection was debated as the middle class was expecting tax relief from this budget. However, sir said we need to understand that at present government revenue sources dried so they are also not in a situation to provide any rebate. A lot of emphasis was given to health expenditure in this budget as sir explained health is wealth in real sense.

Sir beautifully explained from where the rupee comes and where it goes. The interest payment is a big burden for the government. Privatization of Institutions of national interest like the defense sector is a big issue. Selling PSU which are in profit or of in loss because of administrative issues should not be the strategy. AtmaNirbhar Bharat Abhiyan was introduced in the budget but it's a long road ahead. The migrant workers faced the brunt of


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the covid -19 pandemic and therefore one nation one card scheme is initiated by the government. It is not good to tax solar products to tap solar energy. Sir raised his concern as the unionbudget has not given priority on human capital formation as it was expected from the budget. Sir said that we need to put in effort to strengthen Indian higher education system as Indian higher education sector is not on par with the international level.

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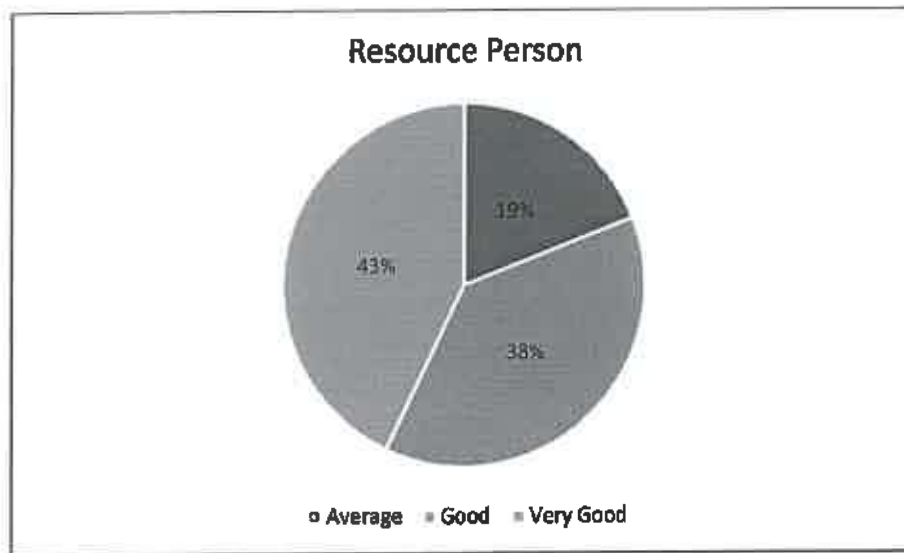

Brief Report of the Program:-

The program started at 11.00 a.m. with the opening remarks given by IQAC Coordinator Dr. Eknath Zhrekar. The welcome address was given by principal Dr. Padma Rangan. Dr. Anaya Markandeya introduced the resource person Ms. Keyaa Mukherjee.

Ms. Mukherjee is an office superintendent at her college. She is well known for her work in digitally transforming the office work of her college. She opined that to achieve the goals of sustainable development in an environment-friendly manner, it is inevitable to go for paperless and digital administration. Digital Technology can be used for Management of various aspects of College Administration like Electronic Correspondence, Electronic Service Record, Digital File Archive, Students information, inventory Management. Madam explained the Student's Information Management System. She said that we have to minimize the use of paper and increase the use of digital documents. The use of E -Correspondence Management was explained in great detail by Ms. Keyaa Mukherjee. The system makes it very easy to receive and send the document at one click. Madam explained the E correspondence system, its Inward numbering, Concerned Departments who should be tagged likewise Outward Correspondence system in a very simple manner. Optimize Storage System and Option of Advance Search also there to search any document. Due to the digitalisation of administrative work, it's possible to work from home during this lockdown period. Staff can access there documents 24* 7 for anywhere in the world.

She explained that E-Service Records, NOC, Approval Letter, Online Leave Records can also be maintained online. Most important how can you maintain salary records in digital forms. How much money can be saved by reducing paper realms was also discussed during the session. She emphasized that you can be ready for any audit because of a fully digitalized accounting system. The benefit of digitalization is increased productivity, reduces cost, the benefit of working remotely, enhanced improved customer service, disaster protection, and tackles the challenge of global warming. The First Step is to go for physically properly

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manage the permanent records, sorting and colour coding and should be kept in a centralised record room and then go for digitalization according to Ms. Mukherjee. Madam explained the importance of Execution of DCRM as per quality management system in great detail. Particularly why internal admin audit is necessary to improve the quality and productivity of the teaching and non-teaching staffs. How to keep List of Permanent Records of the institutes in the digital forms in a manner of Starting with government Records, university records, other records ,audit records and Important GRS records for streamlining the institution work was also explained by her. Mrs. Key Mukherjee Madam briefly explained data centricity from the NAAC perspective.

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
Career Advancement Scheme Workshop Report

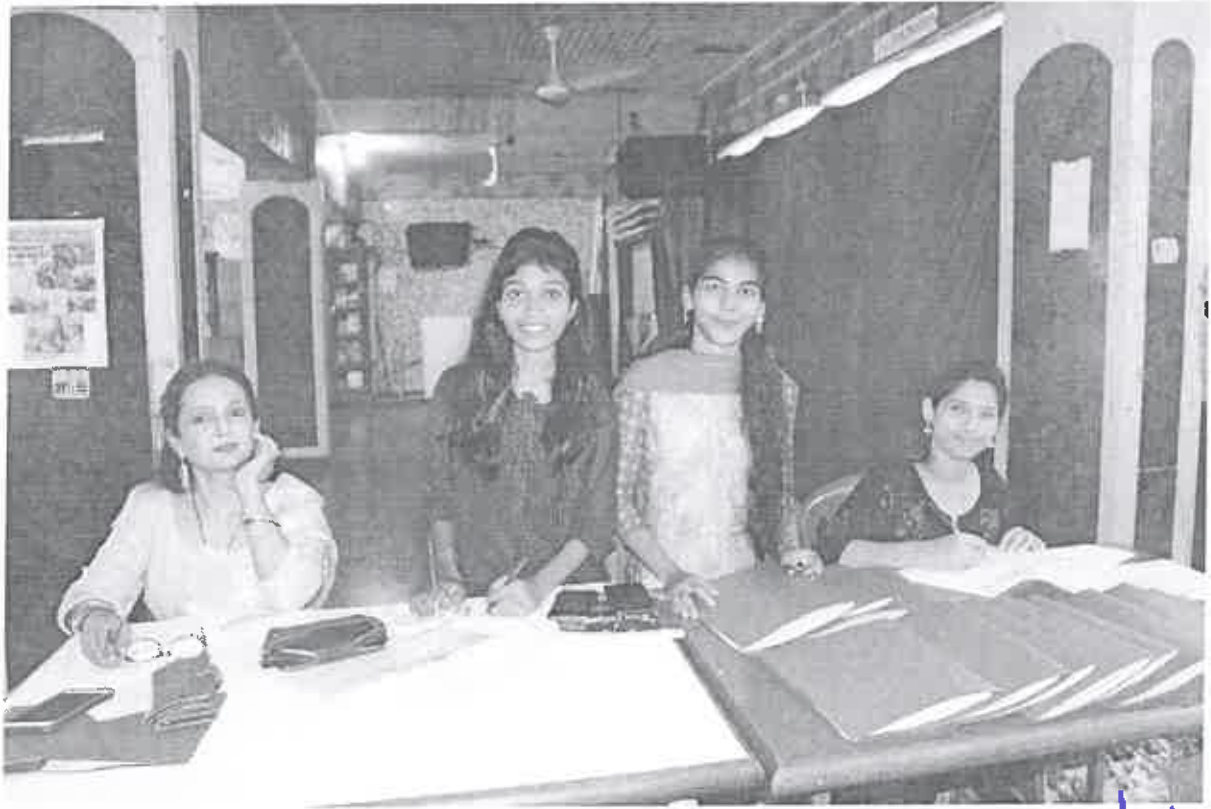

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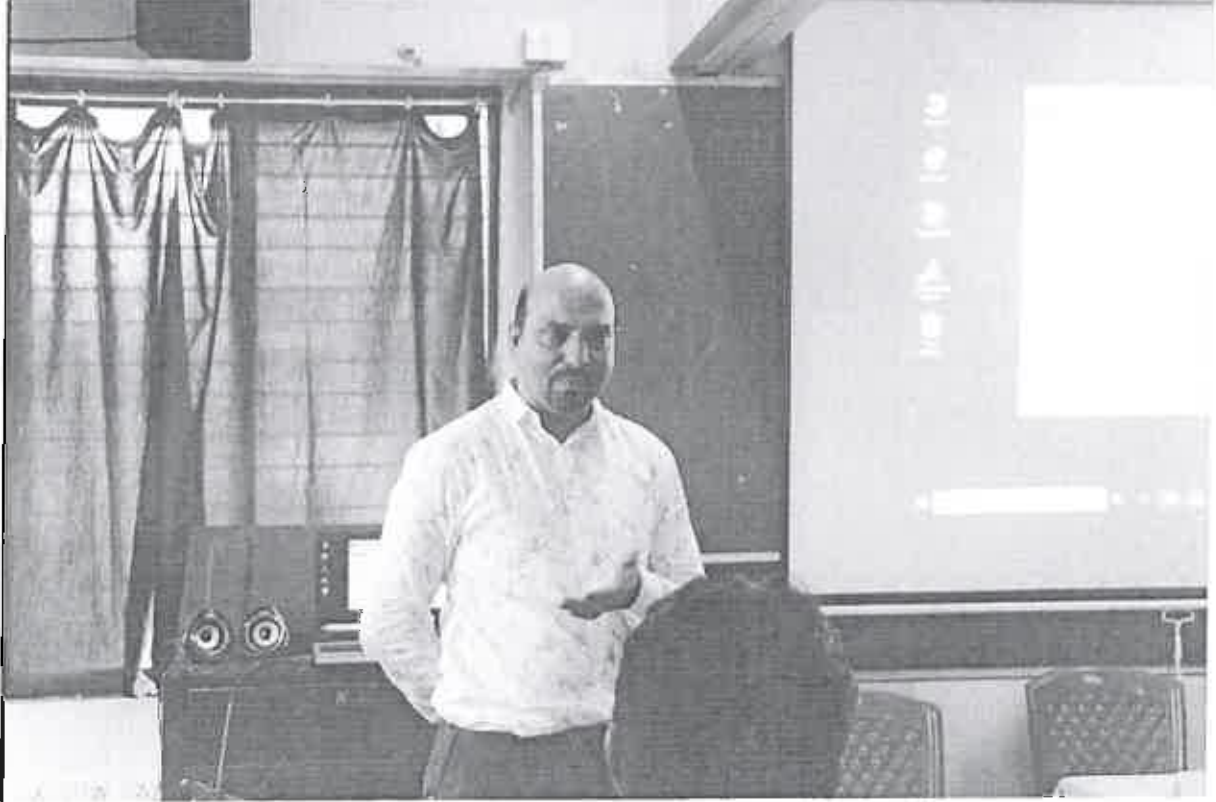


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**National Level Panel Discussion on

Brief Report of the Program:-

The program started at 11.00 a.m. with the opening remarks given by IQAC Coordinator Dr. Eknath Zhrekar. The welcome address was given by principal Dr. Padma Rangan. Dr. Anaya Markandeya introduced the resource person Ms. Keyaa Mukherjee.

Ms. Mukherjee is an office superintendent at her college. She is well known for her work in digitally transforming the office work of her college. She opined that to achieve the goals of sustainable development in an environment-friendly manner, it is inevitable to go for paperless and digital administration. Digital Technology can be used for Management of various aspects of College Administration like Electronic Correspondence, Electronic Service Record, Digital File Archive, Students information, inventory Management. Madam explained the Student's Information Management System. She said that we have to minimize the use of paper and increase the use of digital documents. The use of E -Correspondence Management was explained in great detail by Ms. Keyaa Mukherjee. The system makes it very easy to receive and send the document at one click. Madam explained the E correspondence system, its Inward numbering, Concerned Departments who should be tagged likewise Outward Correspondence system in a very simple manner. Optimize Storage System and Option of Advance Search also there to search any document. Due to the digitalisation of administrative work, it's possible to work from home during this lockdown period. Staff can access there documents 24* 7 for anywhere in the world.

She explained that E-Service Records, NOC, Approval Letter, Online Leave Records can also be maintained online. Most important how can you maintain salary records in digital forms. How much money can be saved by reducing paper realms was also discussed during the session. She emphasized that you can be ready for any audit because of a fully digitalized accounting system. The benefit of digitalization is increased productivity, reduces cost, the benefit of working remotely, enhanced improved customer service, disaster protection, and tackles the challenge of global warming. The First Step is to go for physically properly

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manage the permanent records, sorting and colour coding and should be kept in a centralised record room and then go for digitalization according to Ms. Mukherjee. Madam explained the importance of Execution of DCRM as per quality management system in great detail. Particularly why internal admin audit is necessary to improve the quality and productivity of the teaching and non-teaching staffs. How to keep List of Permanent Records of the institutes in the digital forms in a manner of Starting with government Records, university records, other records ,audit records and Important GRS records for streamlining the institution work was also explained by her. Mrs. Key Mukherjee Madam briefly explained data centricity from the NAAC perspective.

- Workshop on Social Scientific Temper

On 22nd September, 2018 a Workshop on “**Social Scientific Temper**” was organized for the students of S.Y.B.Com. Division A and B. The organizers were the resource persons from CMCA CAMPUS YUVA Citizenship and Life Skills Education Ms. Effy Acharya and Ms. Brinda Ganesh. The workshop was organized in room number 401 from 6.45 p.m. to 8.15 p.m.



The Social Scientific Temper Workshop is part of a series of workshops announced for college students. The class was divided into groups. One group was sent out of the class. Four students volunteered to read the case on hand. There was a narrator and three students played the role of citizens from different groups of society.

The narrator began with stating the real story where four young men from another state living in Maharashtra, working in Maharashtra visited the police station to give the officers some personal details about themselves as this was a requirement for their job. The police officers received the young men well, spoke to them respectfully and the formalities were completed. The four young men had to leave Maharashtra and go back to their home town in another state to attend a family wedding. They were away for a month. This was the true story.



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A Municipal Corporater visited a housing society to address them before the local elections. In his talk he narrated the story stating that many young boys from outside states are roaming around the city. They work in the city and live on rent in housing societies. These boys are anti-social elements and criminals. The Corporater warned the society members not to allow boys from different states to enter the society. He asked them to be careful and vigilant about such instances. He wanted to protect members from such criminals.

A member from the housing society hearing this speech immediately sends a WhatsApp message to his friends in different housing societies announcing the arrival of criminal young boys from outside states living on rent in housing societies, posing to work in offices in Mumbai. Do not let them enter your society! These boys are criminals. **BEWARE BOYS FROM OUTSIDE STATES THEY ARE CRIMINALS.**

The students in the class were told the real story by the narrator. The group standing outside did not hear the true story. They were called in when the other members performed their part as the news reporter, Municipal Corporater and Member from the housing society. On listening to them the group that entered the class were asked to form their opinion on what had actually happened. They were influenced by the three stories they heard and believed that there were young boys from an outside state who were criminals.

The entire class listened in pin drop silence and appreciated the gap between reality and what was reported FROM DIFFERENT SOURCES in every instance. The students were called up one by one and asked to comment on what they understood. They explained that each of the characters in the case had twisted the facts to serve their own purpose. The news reports wanted a juicy story, the Municipal Corporater wanted votes and the member of the housing society wanted to connect with his friends with an interesting message. NONE of the stories were true.

The workshop concluded. The objective of the workshop to understand the importance of SCIENTIFIC TEMPER was achieved. Students realised that Reasoning and questioning the source of information is very important. Do not believe blindly what you hear and see. Find out the source of the information and question its authenticity before you believe anything you hear.

This was the message given to the students in the workshop.


